How Euro Banknoten are earned...

- €5 *Banknoten* can be earned during select games/activities.
- A €5 *Banknote* can be earned by voluntarily sharing a topic during “free talk”. This must be done in German of course. You must be able to field follow-up questions to receive credit. (Note: in German one, you will earn the *Banknote* if you can use German to answer my follow-up questions)
- The contribution must be of substance—at the discretion of the teacher. (ZB. “ich weiss nicht.” Will not count.)
- Repeated contributions will not count. “ich auch” is not legit, unless you are able to contribute follow-up information. Daily “pet phrases” may not count: ie. Ich habe Hausaufgaben gemacht. (credit will be given again if follow-up questions or extra information can be added to make the response unique).
- Maximum of € 5 per person per topic. (ie. You don’t keep getting cash every time you answer my follow-up questions within a topic or each time you say a word.)
- €5 can be earned when a new person/topic voluntarily enters the conversation
- Using English within a topic will result in forfeit of the *Banknote*. (unless it is something that we haven’t yet learned).
- New Words must be written in your vocabulary notebook.

IOU—Procedure...

- If you are in need of Euros for bathroom/locker permission, you may write an IOU.
- This IOU will have to be redeemed by the following class period—(simply be prepared to share something in free talk according to the above guidelines).
- Note: Asking to use the bathroom with German does not earn a *Banknote*.
- IOU’s must be paid before making a second request.

Cashing in:

- At the end of each quarter, all Euros collected during the quarter will be collected and recorded.
- Grades will be calculated in relation to the percentage of Euros received to the average of the class. (ie. If the class average is 50, you’ll need 50 for an A, 40 gets a B etc)
- Note: If students choose to “spend” Euros on the above items, these will not be counted in the final count. Students may have to earn back spent Euros in order to accumulate an adequate amount.
